REDUCED RATES FOR DUES

As mentioned in last month's column, the National AGO Membership Office is again sponsoring a REDUCED DUES RATE program for the remainder of the 2006-2007 membership year, which ends June 30, 2007. The reduced rate is for NEW MEMBERS ONLY who join the Guild between February 1 through March 31 of 2007. This rate allows these new members to still receive nine monthly issues of The American Organist (beginning with the March 2007 issue) and, of course, our local Crescendo (up through the June issue, since it is not published during July and August). This is a great way to get potential members to join NOW for the current year prior to the beginning of the new 2007-2008 drive, and to benefit by receiving TAO sooner instead of waiting for the normal subscription dates of December '07- November '08 applied to brand new members who wait to join us for the '07-'08 year. Also note that the National Office currently does not pro-rate memberships based on when one joins the Guild, so this program offers their only discount on dues.

We have recently received several new members (thanks due to the special words of encouragement from those in our present membership), and for that we are very grateful. All you need do is to remind potential members to email or call me to receive our forms (and reduced dues rates), and since most people now have internet access, they can go to our website <www.agophila.org> to download forms very easily. Plus, the website is a good place to learn more about our programs, leadership, opportunities for service to the Guild, and about our musical and social contact as a group throughout the season.

BIO for Paul Jacobs

Paul Jacobs is currently chairman of the organ department at New York's Juilliard School. He came to national attention as a concert organist in 2000 when he twice performed the complete organ works of J.S. Bach in 14 consecutive evenings in New York City and Philadelphia. Later in the year, he trumped that achievement by performing the complete works again in a spectacular 18-hour non-stop marathon in Pittsburgh. In 2000 he was a featured performer for the national convention of the American Guild of Organists in Seattle and in 2004 was a featured artist at the organization's national convention in Los Angeles.

A recitalist possessing a huge repertoire, Paul Jacobs has memorized the complete organ works of Brahms, Franck, and Duruflé, much Messiaen, most of Bach, and a vast range of other organ literature. In 2002 he performed the complete organ works of Messiaen in a series of nine-hour one-day marathons in six American cities: Chicago, Washington DC, Atlanta, San Francisco, Minneapolis, and Seattle, and has more recently repeated the extraordinary performance in New York City. He has performed throughout the United States as well as in South America, Asia, Australia, Canada, and Europe.

Mr. Jacobs has been a featured artist on Public Radio International's "Pipedreams," Bavarian Radio, Brazilian Arts Television, ABC television's World News Tonight, NPR's Morning Edition, and Minnesota Public Radio. He has captured first prizes in numerous competitions, including the 1999 Fort Wayne National Organ Competition, and the 1998 Albert Schweitzer National Organ Competition. He is the first organist ever to be honored with the Harvard Musical Association's prestigious Arthur W. Foote Award. At Yale University, he was awarded numerous honors including the Dean's Prize and the Faculty Prize of the Institute of Sacred Music. His debut recording was released in 2004 on the JAV label and features an unedited release of an all-Bach program.

Paul Jacobs began studying the piano at the age of six and the organ at age 13. By the age of 15 he was appointed head organist of a parish of 3,500 families in his hometown of Washington, Pennsylvania, continuing his organ studies with George Rau and his piano studies with Susan Woodard. He received a full scholarship to study at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia and graduated as a double major, studying organ with John Weaver and harpsichord with Lionel Party. He subsequently received the Master of Music degree and Artist Diploma from Yale, studying organ with Thomas Murray. In 2005 he was honored with the Distinguished Alumni Award from the Yale School of Music, along with violinist Syoko Aki and composer Daniel Asia.

FROM I-95/I-76:

Exit "To Center City - 676 West"; on 676 west go across town to Exit (right) "To Airport - 76 East"; this is a hairpin turn under the expressway that will bring you to 76 East (The Schuylkill Expressway);

Follow Expressway past 30th Street and South Street exits to exit right "University City". Stay right around curve to University Avenue.

Continue on University Avenue through 3 lights to Baltimore Avenue intersection; Get in left turn lanes and wait for left turn green arrow. Turn left on Baltimore Avenue. Keep left as you turn and take left side of fork in road (to Woodland Avenue). Continue on Woodland, about two blocks, until next fork in road. Bear to the right. You are now on Chester Avenue. Continue on Chester past Clark Park and past 45th Street. The house is beyond 45th on the left-hand side (4514 Chester).

FROM Downtown Philadelphia:

Go west on Walnut Street, all the way to 46th Street. Turn Left. Follow 46th, past several stop signs to Baltimore Avenue (first traffic light). Continue on 46th (it bends a little to the left here) to next light (Springfield). Continue on 46th to next intersection (stop sign) Chester Avenue. Turn left. The House is on the right, midway down block.

To return to I-95/I-76:

Go straight on Chester Avenue (East); it will merge into Woodland Avenue after a few blocks; continue on Woodland. At first light, continue straight, then bend to right around the front of the VA Hospital. Keep right. At light you will be turning right onto University Avenue. 


Rendering of seven stop tracker organ for Wesley United Methodist Church - Elkton, MD




