After dinner in Doylestown, Jonathan Ambrosino lectured on the history of the civic organ at Lenape Valley Presbyterian. The annual January JumpStart was held on a cold winter's day in warm and cozy Overbrook Presbyterian. In February, Scott Myers played his winner's recital at Bryn Mawr Pres., and the Legends



III event was held at Tenth Presbyterian on a chilly Friday evening. About seventy attended the Wanamaker Organ Crawl on a fine Saturday morning early in March. At the April event, listeners were blown away by the sound and musicianship of Neos Ensemble at Wayne Presbyterian. The season came into full bloom with the Kimmel Center debut of the Cooper Memorial Oraan. Peter Schickele and dinner at the Union League will cap an awesome year for the Philadelphia Chapter! The Chapter is indebted to the people and the institutions which host our events so willingly. Many were followed by lavish receptions. I'd like to especially thank Jeff Brillhart, Andrew Senn, Dennis Elwell, Paul Jones, and Ray Biswanger.

It takes the effort of quite a few people to pull off everything the chapter does in a year. Until you've actually served as a part of the chapter's boards or volunteered as a worker bee or hosted an event, you really are unaware of all that goes into what we do. If you think we're all a little nuts for doing this, you're probably right. But like all those insane singers who leave the comfort of their warm and cozy homes to sing in your choir, we consider this a labor of love. The movers and shakers of the chapter are people who give up time, money, and fuel not just because we believe in what we do, but because we actually enjoy the work and enjoy each other. Many of you remain uninvolved. It's not that you don't have the ability, and it's not that you can't make the time. Nobody really has the time. The week will be launched with an organ and piano recital by our awesome Sub-Dean, Alan Morrison, and his mother, pianist Jeanine Morrison, playing the IV/87 rank Austin and the newly rebuilt 1872 Steinway Concert Grand Piano at Wayne Presbyterian Church. You are encouraged to attend the concert. It's an extra Chapter Event!

POE students will be staying in the dorms at Villanova and will take lessons and practice each morning during the week in area churches. The afternoons are filled with activities and field trips, some educational and some not, but all fun. The logistics and transportation issues we face are monumental. (While background checks are an inescapable reality these days, they add to the already long list of tasks to be accomplished.) We are renting a bus from Starr Bus Company, but need young at heart (and responsible) chapter members to volunteer to transport students. The even younger at heart (crazy?) will chaperone, staying in the dorm. Some of our faculty have volunteered in these capacities. Paul Jacobs (Juilliard) agreed to teach, but only if he could fully participate as a chaperone as well. Thank you, Paul, for your leadership in the total POE experience! Please consider helping if you are asked.

After POE, I expect to see some of you at the convention in Chicago. This is the last Dean's letter and Crescendo for two months as our next issue is September. I'll be escaping to the mountains in August with no orage or organists in site. I hope your escape has been planned as well. Enjoy your summer!


