## CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Advent is now celebrated by most denominations. It is one of the shortest seasons in the church year. Advent comes from the Latin Adventus which means "coming". It is coupled with the Latin word Redemptoris which means "the coming of the Savior". This is the season of preparation for the coming of the Savior. Adventus is also the Latin equivalent for the Greek word Parousia.

There are many different traditions that have developed to celebrate Advent: Advent Wreath, calendars, and services of Lessons and Carols. The biblical texts appointed for this season are rich in imagery and symbolism. There are interesting characters such as "John the Baptist" for 1 to 2 Sundays; Mary, mother of our Lord; and Elizabeth and Simeon.

This is one of those rare times that the "Second Coming" may be preached on. As musicians, do we take the time to ponder what some of these texts mean for us today? What does it mean when we sing a text that speaks about Jesus coming quickly such as the spiritual "Soon and Very Soon"? As leaders in worship and music, how are we helping people to prepare and to be ready for Christ's return?

This season is also considered penitential. It is a good time to review our lives to see how we are using the gifts God has given us. This is part of the preparation we can do ourselves. Encourage those we work with to do likewise also! Take some time in rehearsals to teach about the text after you have examined it yourself. When we have done some of these things to prepare, possibly we can sing with joy (such as Mary did in the Magnificat) these rich texts in this season of Advent.

# Any organ builder can give you a few pieces of the puzzle...


