Dr. Martha Johnson conducted The Chamber Choir of St. Peter's Church in the Great Valley (Malvern, PA) and the Sarum Consort in a program of solo and choral cantatas that also included a Magnificat for solo voices and choir attributed to Buxtehude. The Sarum Consort, playing early instruments, performed the Sonata in g minor. The St. Peter's Chamber Choir specializes in sacred Renaissance and Baroque music and has recorded Buxtehude cantatas for PGM. --Elizabeth Cochran

During the last year there has been resurgence of membership, and on most Sundays now, half of the worshippers are visitors or new members. Many of the new families have children, especially pre-school children.

ORGANIST: The director of music would play the organ at the two Sunday services. The congregation uses one of the new liturgies from the Evangelical Lutheran Worship service book, and would like to learn at least an additional one. A variety of hymns are used, from several different hymnals. Leading congregational participation is an important part of the music director's job description.



DELIUS SOCIETY PRESENTS SAINT MARK's (Locust St.) CHOIR IN CONCERT

The Delius Society will present the 25 voice semi-professional Saint Marks's Choir in a free concert on Friday, January 25, 2008, at 7:30 PM in Saint Mark's Church at 1625 Locust Street in downtown Philadelphia. The ensemble, now in its 3rd season under the leadership of co-organists and choirmasters Matthew Glandorf and Diane Meredith Belcher, sings a different setting of a choral Mass, an anthem, a motet, and Psalm setting each Sunday at the 11:00 AM Choral High Mass from September through Corpus Christi. There are additional choral evensongs and special services.

For this program, rarely heard choral works of Delius, Warlock, William Lloyd- Webber, Ord, and Holst will be sung. Ms. Belcher will play Lloyd-Webber's *Choral, Cantilena, and Finale* and Delius' *A Song Before Sunrise* as arranged by Dom Gregory Murray. She will also accompany Lloyd-Webber's *Missa Maria Magdalene*.

The Delius Society, now in its 31st season, has previously presented concerts at St. Mark's, the last two being a choral program conducted by Donald Nally and an organ recital by Scott Dettra. The Delius Society donated a pipe in a tuba rank installed at the church several years ago in memory of Dr. Eric Fenby, OBE, who was Delius' amanuensis at Grez-sur-Loing, France, from 1928 to 1934.
