This season's series of Kimmel Center Presents organ concerts concludes with one of the musical world's foremost artists, British organist Dame Gillian Weir. Through her unique career as an internationally-acclaimed concert organist, performing world-wide at the major festivals and with leading orchestras and conductors, Dame Gillian is famous as a distinguished musician known for her artistry and virtuosity and integrity, with her reputation extending well beyond the world of the organ.

Her renown as a performer, which has stimulated numerous young players to follow her, is backed by her scholarly reputation. She is in demand as an adjudicator for all the leading international competitions and as a lecturer, broadcaster, teacher, and writer, while her television appearances have reached vast new audiences. She is a Distinguished Artist in Residence at the John Hopkins University's Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, Maryland, holds the International Chair in Organ at the Royal Northern College of Music in England, and is Prince Consort Professor of Organ at London's Royal College of Music.

Gillian Weir's concert repertoire is exceptional in its breadth and variety, stretching from the Renaissance to the contemporary. She has performed the complete works of Bach as well as those of Messiaen and others. Her pre-eminent position as a Messiaen interpreter has been underlined with the release of his complete organ works on compact disc. This has been universally received with unprecedented praise with such plaudits as Le Monde's (Paris) "This intégrale is a worthy successor to that by Messiaen himself" and with Yvonne Loriod Messiaen's "C'est magnifique!" As an international authority on his music, she has also made major contributions to Faber's "The Messiaen Companion" and other publications. She has received a host of prizes and awards and honors, and in 1996 was created Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth in recognition of her distinguished services to music, after having been made CBE in 1989.

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I have become fond of her charming personality and witty musings. One such account happened about two years ago when she was to present a recital at Ursinus College. Due to a scheduling conflict with the renovations of Bomberger Hall, we had to move the recital to another fairly local church with a very fine instrument, and they graciously accommodated us and the large audience. As I took her to her first practice session, I was half apologizing about the venue change but assured her she would be very content with the instrument and room, which she was. As I began to explain to her that she had plenty of uninterrupted practice time, she began her story. In her perfect British accent, she said that Catherine Crozier had taken her aside on her first tour to the USA and explained, "Now, Gillian, you must understand that it is a very well known fact that every organ blower in the United States is connected to a vacuum cleaner." At which point I opened the sanctuary doors and a vacuum cleaner turned on as if on cue. She threw her hands up in the air and exclaimed something, I don't recall verbatim. But we were both nearly hysterical.

You will undoubtedly see her charm come through in both her verbal comments and playing. As I have always said, her recitals are events. You don't want to miss it!

am just finishing a class on grief using Brahms' *Requiem*. His requiem was based on two deaths he had experienced, Robert Schumann and his mother. What struck me is how once again a composer has taken his personal experience and shared it through music.

Brahms was said to have read scripture every day, specifically using Luther's translation of the Bible. He found death to be painful, but not as anger-filled as in other requiems. Brahms felt if you could put pain in perspective, one could experience hope and eventually peace.

Through the text and music of his *Requiem* one hears so often 'freude' – joy. One does not always think of joy in grief. In the experience of grief, one can experience two feelings that often seem opposite, i.e. sadness and joy. As people of God, this is possible. Brahms uses a number of passages from the Old Testament that bring comfort and hope while relating to passages in the New Testament.

As musicians, we have a mission to bring the music alive, to express these feelings as the composers have. I believe Brahms had a message about death and grief that he shared through his *Requiem*. Our challenge is to discover the messages in the music, and then through us and our groups to share that message.
