Event Clinicians:

In 2009, **Gary Garletts** will mark his 30th year of professional music leadership. He recently began his tenth year as Director of Music/Organist at Ardmore Presbyterian Church, and as Artistic Director of the Chester County Choral Society. Gary earned music degrees at Oberlin College and Duquesne University, having studied organ with Haskell Thomson and Ann Labounsky. He joined the AGO in 1982 and received its Associate Certificate in 1988. Through the years he has served the Pittsburgh, Lancaster and Philadelphia chapters in various capacities. He lives in Havertown with his wife Twila and son Nathan (now a freshman at Alfred University).

Abigail Palmisano is in her 20th year as Director of Music at Carmel Presbyterian Church in Glenside, PA. At Carmel Church she plays the organ for all services and directs the church's five choirs: four vocal choirs ranging from children to adult, as well as a handbell choir. Abigail is also responsible for the church's concert series, now in its ninth season.

In April, Abigail was honored to be the accompanist for *The Festival of Singing Children* celebrating the 90th birthday of composer/educator, Helen Kemp.

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EAN'S LETTER

ave you ever wondered why you sit on the organ bench and play for services, weddings, funerals, or other events? Of course, it is your job! What drew you to this profession? Ultimately it is the music. We use the organ as an instrumental "medium" to cast our spell. If you are like me, you wonder many times if anyone



is really listening or if they care. Are we providing a type of Muzak? The answer is no. We play because WE care, and you never know when the listener is going to be emotionally touched by what we do. Some specific pieces evoke memories with some people. Other times it is just a personal revelation. I have numerous examples of when this has happened to me at the oddest of times, and I am sure you all have had these experiences too. Or if you haven't been told directly by the person(s) you touched, I guarantee that you have ministered more than you know. But let me share one remarkable true story that happened to my mother.

As many of you know my mother is a pianist, and her name is Jeannine (Romer) Morrison. Years ago, she was traveling and playing recitals under the auspices of Columbia Artists (Community Concerts), and one such venue was a mental institution. She was instructed to play a recital as she would anywhere else and to dress in a gown just as she would anywhere else. I'll cut to the end. They had arranged a reception for the residents, and my mother was surrounded by guards. At one point, an elderly woman came up to my mother and took her hands. She studied them closely as tears streamed down her cheeks. She looked my mother in the eyes and told her that her music was the most beautiful she had ever heard. She then left. One of the staff members standing there with my mother was stunned and said that those were the first words anyone had heard her speak in all the years she had been at the institution. Of course, that reduced my mother to tears!

So remember, among the noisy congregations or sparsely attended events, you never know how you may touch someone in a very profound way. Love what you do and do it with love.

DUAL VS. PRIMARY

Sometimes I get questions about what exactly are the requirements of Dual membership. You first must have a REGULAR or SPECIAL voting membership in good standing with a primary chapter in order to be a DUAL member at a secondary chapter. You must have a STUDENT voting membership with a primary chapter in order to be a STUDENT DUAL member at a secondary chapter. On the form sent to the primary chapter, you need to check off either REGULAR, SPECIAL or STUDENT categories and send your payment for that amount to that chapter. On a separate form for your secondary chapter, you need to check off DUAL or STUDENT DUAL, (name your primary chapter on the form), and send payment to that chapter. Members may not be registered only as Dual members in both chapters.


